Nominees must have made a special contribution internationally or nationally to promote the development of science and scientific research in the fields of gynaecology and obstetrics, and, throughout their careers, have promoted better health care for women, mothers and their children. **Please note that previous recipients of this award are not eligible for inclusion and that only one nomination may be made by each society.**

NOMINATION

Nominations must be made by FIGO member societies.

The nomination must include:

- A fully completed Nomination Form (attached)
- A detailed biography of the nominee
- A recent photograph
